Class for High School Students with Asperger Syndrome

The Douglass Developmental Disabilities Center at Rutgers University offers a class for high school students with Asperger Syndrome. This class, designed to provide students with the intensive support necessary to successfully transition to adult life, is staffed with two certified special education teachers and an assistant for five students. The goals of the class include:

- achievement of academic requirements for a high school diploma or achievement of a GED
- achievement of standardized test-taking skills
- improving social skills
- career awareness and job sampling
- accessing community resources
- securing and maintaining a part-time job
- transitioning to post secondary education
